

Welcome to Sahara Care's revamped newsletter, bringing you information on events, activities and developments from our assisted and supported living services in east London.

In this edition, we will feature residents from our Parkside and Sahara House services and give an update on the creative projects that our Sahara Lodge and Gardens have been working on. We also look back at 2023, as we reflect on all the achievements of our teams throughout the past 12 months.

A welcome note from Alan Betts, Director and Nominated Individual

As always, it has been an exciting year with the organisation seeing significant changes in the way that we operate our services. The introduction of the Log My Care tool has provided an opportunity to record service user's daily notes in real time, meaning that we have live data in terms of incidents and day-to-day activities. This means that we are much more responsive in terms of operational oversight. This together with the implementation of Coolcare and the Grey Matters e-learning platform, has provided the organisation with sound foundations in terms of our digital recording systems as we move into the new year.

The organisation has undertaken a significant investment in its environments, with new double glazing installed in the whole of Sahara House plus a new kitchen. Both Sahara Parkside and Sahara Lodge and Gardens have seen replacement boilers installed with Sahara Parkside seeing further improvements across individual apartments and Sahara Lodge and Gardens seeing Phase 1 of its new kitchen.

Next year we will be looking to enhance Sahara Lodge in terms of the kitchen area as we get Phase 2 of the refurbishment underway and further works are planned at Sahara Parkside (watch this space).

Sahara Care continues to grow, and we have welcomed a number of new service users to the Sahara family over the last 12 months. Sadly, we have also said goodbye to a few of our residents, some that had been with us since the start of our journey.

Next year we will see our Supported Living offer expand with admissions into our Shrewsbury Road site, the utilisation of our properties in Newham and we are currently awaiting the outcome of our tender submissions to secure places on the LB Newham and LB Barking and Dagenham Supported Living Frameworks. Both these will enable the organisation to develop additional supported living schemes in these locations.

Finally, I would like to end by saying a massive thank you to each and every staff member who plays a part in the success of Sahara Care.

The organisation wouldn't be where we are without the dedication, commitment, and resilience of our team and on behalf of the Sahara Care Board, I would like to extend our sincere thanks for everything that they do to ensure the people we support receive an excellent service.

It is important to remember that, at this time of year more than any other time, we are here because we care about people. Not just the people we are supporting but each other too.

Let's make this Christmas a time to celebrate and look forward to the year that is to come.

Residents from Sahara Lodge and Gardens recently enjoyed a performance of Concrete Youth's new multisensory theatre production, The Whispering Jungle. The team at Concrete Youth brought together sensory play and sensory puppets in an immersive production aimed at those with multiple learning difficulties. The Whispering Jungle was developed off the back of Concrete Youth's pioneering ASMR Project. This is an international research project that brought together UK, US and Singapore academics, artists and professionals to explore the impact of autonomous sensory meridian response (ASMR) on people labelled with profound and multiple learning disabilities for the very first time.





Patricia Allen, Deputy Manager of Sahara Lodge and Gardens commented, "The interaction with the audience was fantastic, which made the experience even more special for our service users. The production from this theatre company is ideal for our residents who require a high level of sensory interaction."
